

Technical working groups now incorporated into the Project, as foreseen in the Bylaws.



Update on Preliminary Baseline Design Report

- Joint effort of the Collaboration and Project
- Was used to guide the review panel of the NSF MSRI-1 Design and Development award in May.
- Effort now focused on
 - Improving flow-down from Science to Measurement requirements (Chapters 1 & 2)
 - Strengthening justification of the Baseline Design (Section 3.1)
 - Completing Design Validation Appendices
- Timeline: "publishable" draft by Nov 1, 2021 for CMB-S4 Project Director's review
- Required document for NSF PD and DOE CD-1 reviews expected to be held in 2022 (see John Corlett's Project update talk)




We encourage junior scientists to register for this school which is focused on the analysis of millimeter data from highresolution CMB experiments and cross-correlation with optical data sets. This workshop will be of relevance to those who are interested in cosmology and astrophysics research. A familiarly with Python is recommended.

This three-day remote school will run **August 16-18, 2021,** from 11am-5pm Eastern. We will use **Jupyter notebooks** to teach basic CMB and optical oriented analysis skills. We will also facilitate access to existing data sets from <u>ACT</u> and <u>SPT</u>.


Our jobs (quoted from the bylaws section 9.6):




- applicants for Senior and Independent Postdoc: fill out google form

Supervisor Interface



- Student/Postdoctoral members:
 - to support job applications, you may request intended Senior member status by submitting your research plan to the Membership Committee.
 - once you have a new position, you must apply for Senior or Independent Postdoc membership by submitting a membership application form, or have your new supervisor designate you for membership, as appropriate.
- · Senior members:
 - to view, edit and add your supervised student and postdoc members use the supervisor interface.
 - if you change institutions simply update your membership record accordingly:

MC - Activity Reports

- Transitioned to a new tool (google form rather than survey monkey), tied to member records (for auto-population of some fields), and so that only members could fill it out.
- Reviewed all "provisional" members who submitted activity reports, for possible transition to "full" membership. In Governing Board's (GB's) hands now.
- Nearly done reviewing the rest, will send a report to the GB soon.

Bylaws plans (Not official yet, in GB hands)

 Recommended (to Spokespeople and GB) a reorganization of membership types and "status qualifiers". Here is what is under consideration:

Membership types

- Senior, Postdoctoral, Student, Legacy, Provisional
- PD and Student membership -> limited term, end date in membership record.
 Can be extended by supervisor.

Status qualifiers

- Full
- Provisional (between initial application and full, for Senior and Indep PD)
- Pending (for Student->Indep. PD and PD->Senior transitions)
 - For those who have applied for new status, application being reviewed.
- Inactive
 - Those who have failed to respond to requests for activity reports or renewals in a timely manner, or are otherwise deemed insufficiently active.

 - Maintain contact with EDI initiatives outside of the collaboration to keep the collaboration informed of best practices







The Ombudspeople

- are independent, neutral, and confidential resources for CMB-S4 collaboration members to bring any CMB-S4 related concern.
- provide an alternate and informal channel of communication
- listen to people and offer information about CMB-S4 policies and procedures.
- help people who seek a confidential channel for discussing or addressing an issue of concern without fear of retribution.
- help to promote ethical conduct and values; to alleviate disruption caused by disputes; and to identify policies, practices, or issues where a systems change may be appropriate.
- provide a place for people to seek guidance on how to report actual or potential violations of CMB-S4 obligations, and, if they wish it, to do so anonymously.
- follow the <u>International Ombudsman Associations Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice</u>.

Neutral Unaligned Impartial Confidential Independent Informal

The Ombudspeople

- are designated neutral and remain unaligned and impartial.
- strive to promote procedural fairness in the content and administration of the collaboration's practices and processes and policies.
- do not engage in any situation that could create a conflict of interest.
- will not answer questions about people with whom they may have spoken, or disclose an individual's name or specific issue.
- do not keep permanent records of confidential communications. Permanent records kept by the Ombudspeople include only statistical information for analyzing and reporting trends and recommendations to the collaboration. All other records are regularly destroyed.
- are independent in structure, function and appearance to the highest degree possible within the organization.
- work informally and have no power to make, change, or set aside administrative decisions or CMB-S4 policy.
- The ombuds people provide a report to the S4 community on a yearly basis
