

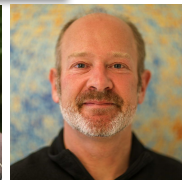

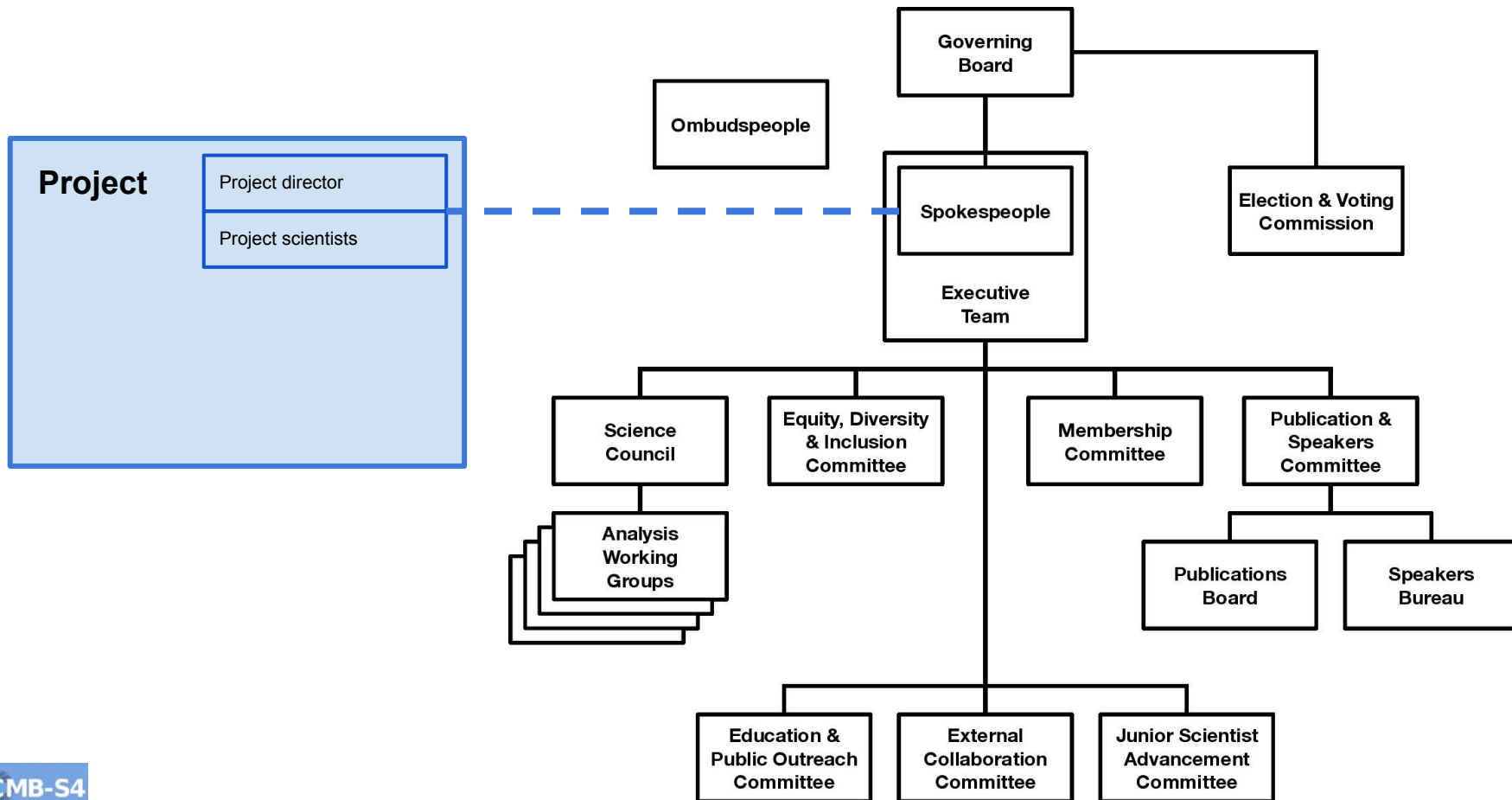

Framework for international partners 1/2

- US agencies that are funding the bulk of project (on behalf of the US participants) will insist on contributions from non-US partners on behalf of collaborators at non-US institutions.
- This means that, after a time, non-US participants will need to be represented by an institution/agency/consortium that is responsible for a defined contribution to the project. For some time, the welcome letters have noted this to new members from outside the US.
- The project will negotiate individual agreements with partner agencies.
- We have been developing a preliminary framework document that captures our goals for what those agreements to look like, and sharing it with the project director, project scientists, and governing board.
- Many details to work out
- Make sure the Executive Team and Governing Board know your concerns

Framework for international partners 2/2

- Working concept's main features:
 - Contributions that are negotiated with the project will come with a certain number of senior memberships.
 - Contributions to CMB-S4 may be cash or in-kind.
 - In-kind contributions must either directly offset construction project costs (such as project hardware) or otherwise enable the project (providing a site, validating and verifying the design, or retiring risk).
 - May include contributions to other projects that are repurposed for CMB-S4.
 - The project determines the value of the contribution
 - The partner institutions may designate who is to be considered eligible for membership under the agreement.
 - Our governing board will maintain final control over our membership, and collaboration structure/governance is unchanged.
 - Partner agencies can provide feedback to the project via an advisory *Project Resource Board*.
 - Once the framework goes into effect, members will have a reasonable time period (perhaps 18 months) to show that progress toward an agreement is occurring.

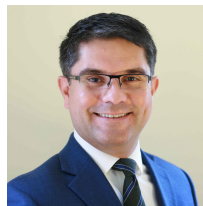

- **Volunteer** in advance – SB often has little time to respond to a conference's request for a speaker, so let SB know your interests/expertise in advance.
- **Always include** “*for the CMB-S4 Collaboration*” on your title slide!

- [Project Proposal Template](#) – latest version (tex template), easy to fill in.
- Define [project category](#) as either Key Science (alphabetical authors), Non-Key Science Data, Non-Key Science Forecast/Technical Report (defined in [Bylaws](#) 9.3). Since we don't have data yet, *almost all proposals should be in the last category!*
- 5 papers published in last year, 2 in review, many in process. Keep 'em coming!

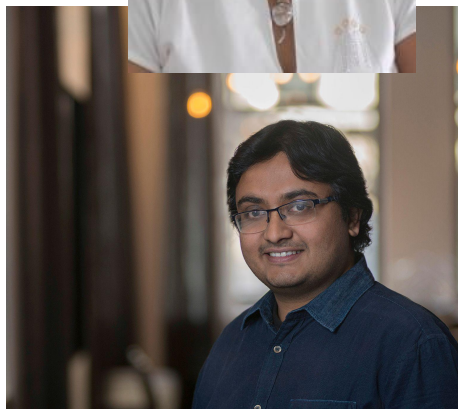
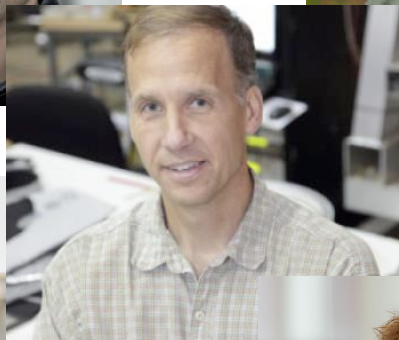

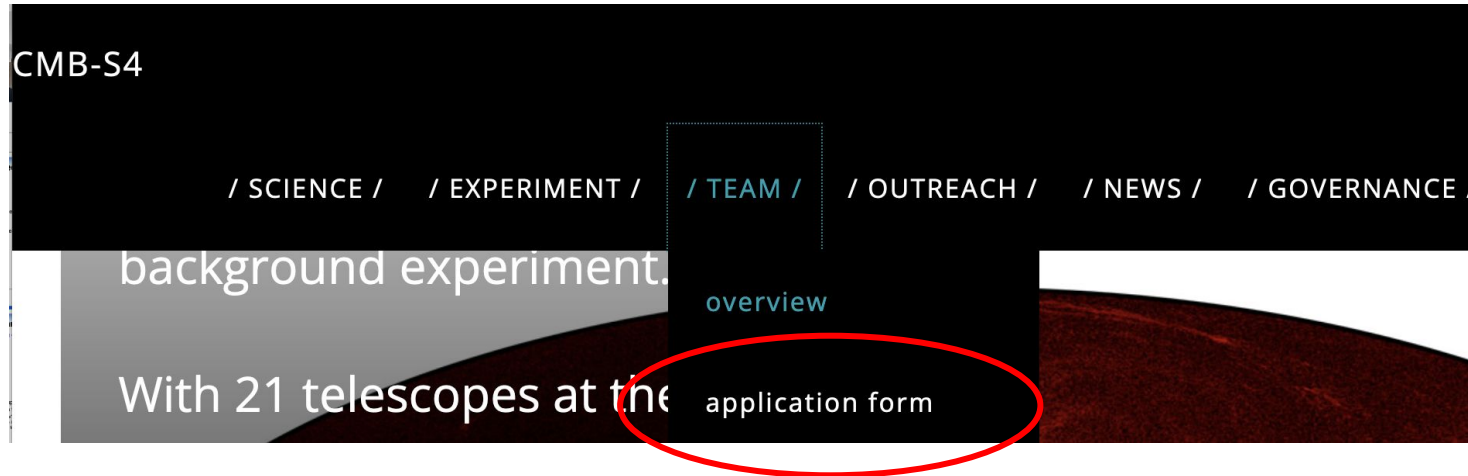

Membership Applications and Changes in Status

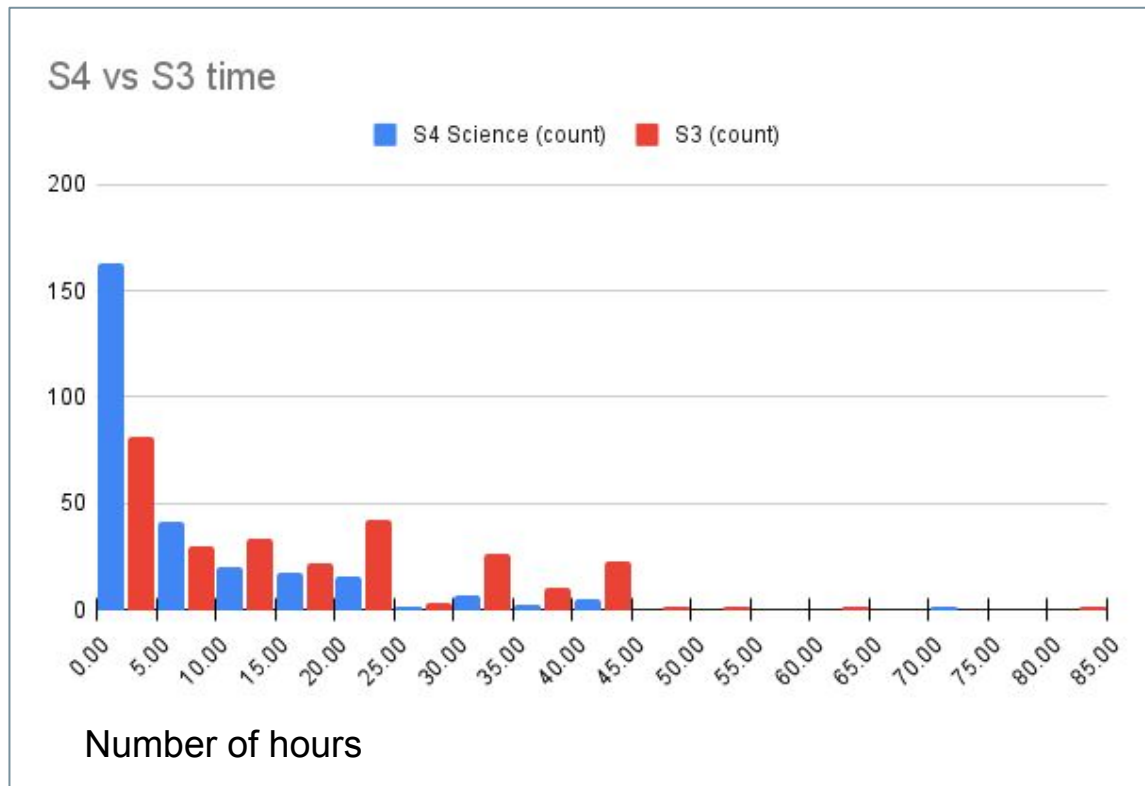
- New Senior members: Go to cmb-s4.org -> **TEAM** -> **application form**

2022 Activity Reports

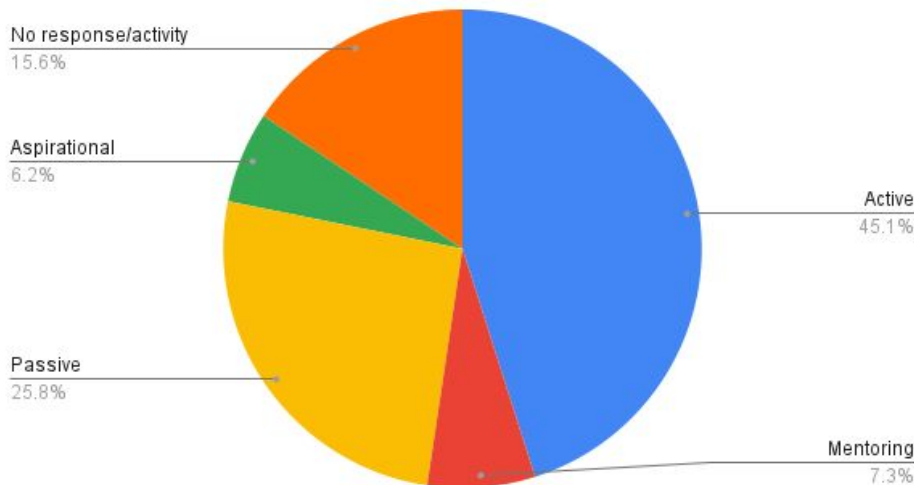
- 287 of 338 members responded

LiteBIRD-S4 MoU

- MoU was signed earlier this year to support joint forecasting work, after a period of circulation to the Collaboration for comment.
- It allows for work to proceed to assess the impact of
 - LiteBIRD high-frequency and low-frequency maps on CMB-S4 r forecasts, and
 - CMB-S4 de-lensing information on LiteBIRD r forecasts.
- Other analyses are possible via amendment of the MoU
- The low-ell BB group is coordinating the (just-now-starting) effort on the S4 side.
- Work will be done by a joint Working Group. Contact the low-ell BB co-chairs if you are interested in participating.
- Results will be published in a joint paper that will be a Key paper.
- The author list will be “The CMB-S4 and LiteBIRD Collaborations:” followed by an alphabetical list of the authors, as determined by each collaboration’s authorship rules.

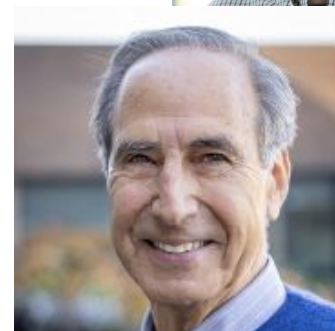

Ombuds report 2022

The ombuds had two visits on issues of conflict within the collaboration in 2022.

*Issues in your working group? Issues at a meeting? Issues with your advisor?
Worried about a CMB-S4 policy or procedure?*

We are always here to talk to you about issues that are concerning. They don't have to be clear/"obvious" violations of the Code of Conduct → if you feel bad about engaging in CMB-S4, reach out to chat informally.

The Ombudspeople

- are independent, neutral, and confidential resources for CMB-S4 collaboration members to bring any CMB-S4 related concern.
- provide an alternate and informal channel of communication
- listen to people and offer information about CMB-S4 policies and procedures.
- help people who seek a confidential channel for discussing or addressing an issue of concern without fear of retribution.
- help to promote ethical conduct and values; to alleviate disruption caused by disputes; and to identify policies, practices, or issues where a systems change may be appropriate.
- provide a place for people to seek guidance on how to report actual or potential violations of CMB-S4 obligations, and, if they wish it, to do so anonymously.
- follow the [International Ombudsman Associations Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice](#).

Neutral Unaligned Impartial Confidential Independent Informal

The Ombudspeople

- are designated neutral and remain unaligned and impartial.
- strive to promote procedural fairness in the content and administration of the collaboration's practices and processes and policies.
- do not engage in any situation that could create a conflict of interest.
- will not answer questions about people with whom they may have spoken, or disclose an individual's name or specific issue.
- do not keep permanent records of confidential communications. Permanent records kept by the Ombudspeople include only statistical information for analyzing and reporting trends and recommendations to the collaboration. All other records are regularly destroyed.
- are independent in structure, function and appearance to the highest degree possible within the organization.
- work informally and have no power to make, change, or set aside administrative decisions or CMB-S4 policy.
- The ombuds people provide a report to the S4 community on a yearly basis
